#### The Rally that was

Over the weekend of May 5—9, 2022 the Skeleton

Coast Rally was once again hosted by HOG Namibia and held in Swakopmund.

From the outset, thanks and appreciations are extended to the Rally Crew, who did a sterling job in organizing and presenting the rally—from all angles

the rally was hailed as a huge success.

Many of our HOG Namibia members were there and will concur that the rally is not to be missed in 2024 and, unfortunately those of you who, for whatever reason could not make it, don't worry, there will be a next time.

One of the highlights of the rally was the auction in support of the Swakopmund Township Dog House Project. With the generous support of the bidders, (ja Herman ek praat spesifiek van jou en Estee) a whopping N\$ 65 600 was raised and HOG Namibia Chapter boosted the income by a further N\$ 10 000, bring-

ing the total to N\$ 75 600. The funds are used to support local business in buying and assisting the project as and where needs are identified



### Our Charity of Choice

Having called for suggestions of charities which the HOG Namibia Chapter can support and partner with, the decision fell on the Ruach Elohim Foundation (Hebrew for Breath of God). Ruach Elohim Foundation is a voluntary non-profit organization in Namibia focusing on the awareness of baby dumping, as well as the care of unwanted, abandoned, abused and neglected babies. It is all good and well to have identified a charity which we as HOG Namibia Chapter can support, but the big challenge is, how do we intend to support them? To this end, we are in the planning stages to host a "Bike Show" on the premises of Old Wheelers on September 3, 2022. All dealers and makes of bikes will be invited to show-case their motor bikes, merchandise, service, etc.—maybe even offer test runs and hopefully sell a bike or two. We intend to charge an entrance levy

in the form of a pack of nappies, can of Nan milk powder, baby growth, etc and if you are empty handed, a minimal entrance fee of N\$ 50 (or thereabouts).

Shortly after the Bike Show, we will drive through to Swakopmund and hand over the donation.

the meantime and let's make it a memorable family fun day for all biker families

#### International Female Ride Day

Social get-togethers had always been the order of the day and the Windhoek H-D owners would meet at Parguel's Restaurant for a beer and an ad-hoc run. The Coastal H-D owners would meet on weekends and take a ride out to the "boompie" and feed the birds. All of this, however, very unplanned and unstructured.

With the perseverance of one H-D owner, however, more and more H-D owners were identified and encouraged to join the informal, yet social gathering, up to a point when all were in agreement that we should try to formalise the H-D owners into a recognised group. This was pushed by none other than Waltie Kleynhans, who also was to become the first Director of the H.O.G. Namibia Chapter.

The H.O.G. Tyger Valley Dealership from Cape Town had attended an Expo in Windhoek during May 2013, which formed a strong basis of H-D owners from across Namibia to get together and it was by this association, that the Tyger Valley Dealership was approached to request them sponsoring the H.O.G. Namibia Chapter. And thus it came to be that on July 24, 2013 the H.O.G. Namibia was registered as an official Harley Owners Group, comprising of 33 founding members
