Maltahöhe—"Lace & Leather"



Safety Tips

You are about to undertake a trip with your bike, all ready packed, and that niggling feeling in the back of your mind of "what if something goes wrong?", keeps on popping up.

There is no point in losing sleep over a situation that you have no control over, but you can at the very least ensure that you have done what could be done.

So, before you take to the road, make sure your bike is in a roadworthy condition, simply by applying the "T-Clock" checklist.

T-tyres & wheels. Check that your tyre pressure is within safe parameters along with the condition of your tyre tread. Check that your spokes are firm and intact and that the wheel spins freely.

- C—Controls on your handle, i.e. levers, cables. Make sure they are lubricated and not frayed. Check your throttle to make sure it is not too lose and that it snaps back when released.
- L-Lights and Electrical. Your brake- and taillight as well as your headlights are functional, as well as indicators. Check that battery is tight.
- O-Oil and Lubricants. Check fluid levels for your fuel, brake, transmission, (coolant). Make sure there are no fuel or oil leaks
- C—Chassis. Bit more complicated, but check the chassis for wear and tear; cracks in your chassis, such

- as peeling or lifting of the paint work. Look for damaged, lose or missing clips or pins. Also check the tension of your drive belt
- K—Kickstand. Check your kickstand to see if it retracts properly. If the kickstand is lose when retracted, check the cut-out switch and springs for wear and

There you have it. When in doubt let a qualified technician double check your concerns.

This simple safety check should give you smiles for your miles.

The HOG Namibia Marshals

The Marshal Corps of the HOG Namibia Chapter plays a critical part in the safety of our members, especially when we are riding in formation, e.g. during a Thunderparade. But what is of greater importance is that the members must have faith and trust in the Marshals to ensure that their ride will be safe and hassle-free.

At the 2021 AGM, the decision

was reached that all currently appointed Marshals will stand down, i.e. that they re no longer appointed as Marshals.

New Marshals will be appointed following the Marshal training on 9 & 10 April 2022 and those members who have completed the Skills Rider Training (preferably the advanced course) are encouraged to attend this training pro-

gram.

Once the Marshals have been appointed they will elect the Head Road Captains, the Road Captains, and the Safety Officer from their Corps, where such appointments will be for a period of two years.

Let's ride safe.
